TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE JOINT TASK FORCES ON CAMPS TRANSFORMATION (JTFCT)

I. THE JOINT TASK FORCES ON CAMPS TRANSFORMATION (JTFCT)

The Annex on Normalization provides for confidence-building measures that may be undertaken through Joint Task Forces for the six (6) previously acknowledged MILF camps with the end in view of transforming these areas into peaceful and productive communities.

There shall be Joint Task Forces for each of the six (6) previously-acknowledged MILF camps. Their work shall be coordinated and supervised by four (4) Coordinators, two (2) each from the GPH and the MILF.

II. TASKS

1. The Coordinators of the JTFCT

The Coordinators of the JTFCT shall perform the following tasks:

- a. Provide overall leadership and direction for the transformation of the six (6) previously acknowledged MILF camps into peaceful and productive communities.
- b. Coordinate and provide the necessary logistical support for the work of the Joint Task Forces in each of the six camps.
- c. Establish the protocols to be observed in the conduct of camp development.
- d. Tap the necessary government agencies, development partners, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), private sector, and local government units (LGUs) for the implementation of programs/projects.
- e. Supervise and monitor the implementation of the plans and programs of the six Joint Task Forces.
- f. Address planning and implementation concerns of the six Joint Task Forces.

2. The JTFCT

As provided in the Annex on Normalization, the Joint Task Forces will assess the needs, plan appropriate programs, and undertake necessary measures to transform these areas into peaceful and productive communities.

III. COMPOSITION

- 1. Each JTFCT shall be composed of two (2) members each from the GPH and MILF.
- 2. Each JTFCT shall have a support staff commensurate to its technical, operational and administrative requirements.
