

The NAPWPS 2023-2033 is scheduled to be launched in the 1st Quarter of 2023. As such, the localization in 2023 would be impacted. Additionally, the 2 Tracks of localization of the NAPWPS are: 1. Through a Regional Action Plan on WPS, and 2. Integration of WPS interventions into the GAD Plans and Budget (GPB) and GAD Accomplishment Reports (GAD AR) The RAPWPS includes: 1. Regional, multi-stakeholder consultations 2. Presentation and endorsement of the RGADC, then the RDC 3. Adoption of the local government of the RAPWPS into their development plans 4. Periodic assessments of the implementation. 5. Updating/Enhancement based from the results of the periodic assessments. Alternatively, some local governments prefer not going through the process of crafting a RAPWPS, in which case, the local government mainstreams the WPS agenda into the larger GAD mainstreaming, and pursuant to the PCW-OPAPRU JMC 2014-01, integrate WPS PAPs into their GPBs and GAD ARs.


