Hence, the completion of the normalization deliverables will spill over beyond 2022. With the agreeement of both the GPH and the MILF as parties to resume the Phase 3 decommisioning, which commenced last 19 September, 100% (2,450) of the turned-in firearms and 22% (1,200 out of 5,500) combatants were decommisioned for the 3rd Quarter, thus, target for the 3rd Quarter was achieved. For the other activities and programs, the Program 1 has intensified its resource mobilization to ensure that all parallel programs with decommissioning process were also carried out.

Pasil and Camp Astanah in Brgy. Kagay, Indanan, Sulu, respectively. The activity discussed the issues and concerns relative to the process of the verification and profiling of the MNLF combatants in Sulu which is scheduled tentatively in October 2022; 3) Managed activities of the MNLF such as movement of forces, and establishment of new camps among others, through close coordination with the coordinating committee secretariats and its mechanisms; 4) Strengthened coordination with the security sector (AFP, PNP and NICA) resulting in a clearer and closer cooperation and quick feedback mechanism on the security issues involving MNLF individuals or groups; 5) Intensified conduct of activities under the preimplementation phase of the MNLF Transformation Program; and 6) Based on the OPAPRU Roadmap, the BDAF and TIMC are expected to be completed by FY 2025 depending on the support from both parties and the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC). It should be noted that the delivery and completion of these deliverables are jointly agreed upon by the GPH and the MNLF.
